

#### • Research and Development Cell:

In 2020, SBUP launched its Research and Development Center to further its dedication to innovation and intellectual achievement. Since its establishment, the institute has developed into a thriving center for scholarly advancement and research activity. The center was pleased to announce that five research fellows have successfully completed their Ph.D. degrees by the 2023–24 academic year.

The Department of Research and Development at the university is home to thirty eminent Ph.D. guides who contribute to a vibrant research community. These mentors support and work together with 118 Ph.D. candidates who are research scholars in a variety of fields, fostering a vibrant academic community.

Beginning with the 2024–2025 academic year, the R&D department plans to launch a Junior Research Fellowship as part of its ongoing efforts to develop and assist emerging researchers. The purpose of this fellowship is to give rising researchers resources and financial support so they can concentrate on their research without worrying about money.

The research and development department takes the initiative to create a vibrant research culture by planning multiple workshops and seminars. These conferences address a broad range of subjects, such as data analysis methods, publication tactics, academic writing, and advanced research methodology. These programs give researchers the abilities and information need to carry out excellent research and successfully communicate their findings.

Understanding the value of providing incentives for research, the R&D department provides faculty members with a range of financial support options. This includes paying for conference and workshop registration fees, providing seed money for new research projects, and offering rewards for publishing in high-impact journals. In addition to encouraging faculty members to conduct research, this kind of funding makes sure that their findings are seen by a larger student body.

Additionally, the department publishes "The Balajian – Journal of Management Research," a biannual journal with an ISBN. Faculty and research academics can publish their work, exchange ideas, and benefit the larger academic community by using this publication as a platform. The university's expertise in this field and dedication to expanding knowledge in management research are reflected in the journal's concentration on management research.

In general, the goal of SBUP's Research and Development Center is to promote a collaborative, innovative, and academically excellent atmosphere. It contributes significantly to the advancement of the university's research purpose and strengthening of its standing in the academic community through its extensive support networks and programs.

Additionally, the bulk of these articles have received a large number of citations, demonstrating the importance and acknowledgement of our faculty's work in the academic and research communities. #### • Hostel Facilities:

Sri Balaji University Pune (SBUP) offers comprehensive hostel facilities with separate accommodations for boys and girls. We have a very unique structure Hostel where we have developed a group of four rooms and given one common area and we called it a cluster. The boys' hostel consists of 100 rooms, while the girls' hostel has 112 rooms, each designed to house four occupants.
